

M.Sc./Ph.D. OPPORTUNITIES IN CANADA'S MOST NORTHERLY NATIONAL PARK

I am looking for highly motivated, creative and intellectual ecology and environmental science students to conduct graduate research on climate change in Quttinirpaaq National Park (QNP) on northern Ellesmere Island, Nunavut, Canada. My research program focuses on how accelerated climate change in polar regions is altering terrestrial and aquatic ecosystem productivity, greenhouse gas (CO₂, CH₄, N₂O) emissions from landscapes, water quality, and contaminant loadings and biomagnification.

For 5-8 weeks each summer, we conduct our research out of the recently upgraded Lake Hazen Polar Field Laboratory and base station in QNP, which is nestled in an Arctic oasis between the Grant Land Mountains and the shores of the largest lake north of the Arctic Circle. This diverse landscape provides a multitude of research opportunities.
